CARE & MAINTENANCE

Our furniture is designed to live long past the manufacturer warranty. It's also constructed with materials that don't require a lot of upkeep. By following the recommendations below, you'll enjoy your new patio furniture for years to come!

PROTECT YOUR NEW OUTDOOR FURNITURE

When not in use, we recommend using a protective cover with your furniture. During harsh weather and extreme temperatures, we recommend storing the cushions in a shed or garage and covering the frames with protective covers. If you store the frames indoors during the winter, avoid storing upside down, which can trap moisture. Damage caused by the elements, normal wear and tear or improper care is not covered by Harmonia Living's warranty.

HOW TO CLEAN OUTDOOR FURNITURE:

ALUMINUM

Simply hose off or wipe down your frame to clean it. Avoid using harsh cleaners, brushes or power washers, which could damage the finish.

TEAK

Long term, teak furniture develops a pleasing silvery gray patina, which is cosmetic and not an indication of dryness. Its natural oils help keep this hardwood strong and durable in a variety of environments, so there's very little maintenance needed. Covering teak furniture will protect the surface from elements such as hail, wind and snow, which can cause cosmetic damage.

To keep the original golden honey finish, apply a very thin layer of Linseed or Teak oil to your furniture 1-2 times a year, depending on exposure. Cleaning

your furniture with teak cleaner is recommended every 2-3 years, along with the oil application.

HDPE WICKER

Simply hose off, or wipe down the wicker with a solution of mild dish soap (just a drop or two) and water with a soft cloth. Do not use harsh chemicals or brushes to clean HDPE wicker.

SLING

In order to prevent stains and protect its new appearance, wipe down the sling with a mixture of soap and water every few weeks. To remove mold, rinse down the furniture with water and scrub gently with a brush.

GFRC / CONCRETE

Wipe up spills immediately with a dry cloth. For overall cleaning, use a soft cloth with a drop of mild dish soap. Rinse off soap and wipe dry.

STEEL

Simply hose off or wipe down your frame to clean it. Avoid using harsh cleaners, brushes or power washers, which could damage the finish. Should the product get scratched or damaged, the metal will begin to rust. You can use Rustoleum spray paint to touch up scratches and prevent rust from spreading.

PERFORMANCE FABRICS

Cleaning your cushions on a regular basis will help prevent build-up of dirt, which can generate mildew. Dirt and dust can be brushed off, while stains can be spot cleaned with mild soap and water. Cushion covers zip off and can be machine washed and air dried; do not put cushion covers in the dryer. For tougher stains, visit the fabric manufacturer's website for additional recommendations.

Tip: If your cushions are left out during a rainstorm, unzip and place the cushion on its side, zipper side down. This will allow the water to drain out quicker.

HOW TO CLEAN & PROTECT INDOOR FURNITURE:

Use a coaster or trivet when placing heavy items, or glassware on the surface top to prevent scratching. Dust regularly with a soft cloth occasionally polish with a lemon oil based product like Old English, please do not use harsh chemicals.



Care & Cleaning

Our fabrics are designed for outdoor use. To keep your fabric looking its best, we recommend cleaning the fabric at the first signs of dirt or stains.

For routine maintenance of your fabrics, we recommend cleaning each spring season.

Normal Stains/Dirt

1. Remove loose dirt with soft bristle brush or hose down with cold water.
2. Clean with mixture of water and mild soap. Rub in mixture with soft brush and allow to thoroughly soak into the fabric.
3. Rinse thoroughly with cold water and air-dry.
4. Never use water over 100 degrees Fahrenheit. Do not machine-dry. For light cleaning, avoid the use of detergents.

Stubborn Stains/Dirt

1. Before bleach cleaning, make sure fabric is dry and has been vacuumed, and that space is ventilated.
2. Prepare a 10% bleach solution in water.
3. Test the solution in an inconspicuous location first before applying over the rest of the fabric.
4. Apply the cleaning solution using a misting spray bottle.
5. Work the solution into the affected area by lightly scrubbing the area with a sponge or soft bristle brush. Make sure to work from the outside of the stain inward so as not to spread the stain and rinse your sponge or brush frequently.
6. Allow cleaning solution to linger on the stain no more than 1 hour.
7. Rinse thoroughly to remove all residual bleach from the fabric.
8. Allow fabric to air dry.
9. Repeat process if necessary.



Upholstery Care and Cleaning

One of the best ways to keep Sunbrella® fabrics looking good is to brush off dirt before it becomes embedded in the fabrics and wipe up spills or clean soon after a spill occurs. The quicker you clean spills, the easier they can be to remove.

Try this first... With a new spill on your Sunbrella fabric.

- Blot (don't rub) liquid spills with a clean, dry cloth. For oil-based spills, apply an absorbent such as corn starch, then remove with a straight edge.
- Spray on a mild cleaning solution of soap (such as Dawn® or Woolite®) and water. • Rinse the fabric thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Air dry.

Try this next... If your first try doesn't get the spill completely out.

Though Sunbrella fabrics can be used both outdoors and in, your cleaning methods should differ slightly indoors and out because of the fabrication and manufacturing of the furniture. We recommend using the appropriate cleaning instructions for your application.

Outdoor Upholstery

Cleaning Removable Fabric

Hand Washing

Soak fabric in a solution of 1/4 cup mild soap per gallon of lukewarm water. Use a sponge or very soft bristle brush to lightly agitate the spill. Then rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue, and allow fabric to air dry.

Machine Washing

Some removable casings can be washed in the washing machine, however consult the furniture manufacturer before removing the casing as cushion construction may vary. To wash, first close all zippers. Machine wash in cold water on the delicate cycle with normal amounts of mild laundry detergent. For severe mold or mildew, add 1 cup of bleach. Allow fabric to air dry.

Cleaning Non-Removable Fabric

Prepare a solution of 1/4 cup mild soap per gallon of lukewarm water. Use a soft bristle brush to clean, allowing the cleaning solution to soak into the fabric. Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue and allow fabric to air dry.

Seam-To-Seam Cleaning

When cleaning upholstered pieces, clean the entire surface area of the fabric, from seam to seam, instead of rubbing the fabric in a circular motion on the spill. This method, along with an extractor, may be required in order to avoid water rings and residue.

Mold and Mildew

Sunbrella fabrics do not promote mildew growth, however, mildew may grow on dirt and other foreign substances if not removed from the fabric. To remove mold or mildew:

- Prepare a solution of 1 cup of bleach and 1/4 cup mild soap per gallon of water. • Spray on entire area and allow to soak into the fabric for 15 minutes. • Clean entire surface area with a sponge, clean towel or very soft bristle brush. • Rinse thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Air dry.

For severe mold/mildew growth, bleach quantities may be increased. It is best to clean the entire surface area of the fabric to avoid water rings and residue.

For other spills, products such as 303® Multi-Surface Cleaner, Dawn®, or Resolve® are applicable. Specific information on spill cleaning is available at sunbrella.com/cleaningguide

Retreating Sunbrella Fabrics

Sunbrella fabrics are engineered to provide long-term performance. After repeated thorough cleanings, or years of use and exposure, you may choose

to refresh your fabrics with an appropriate retreating agent. We recommend 303® Fabric Guard™, available in the United States, and Tex'Activ, available internationally.

Applying a retreatment:

- Clean Sunbrella fabric, using one of the cleaning methods outlined.
- Allow Sunbrella to completely air dry.
- Apply retreatment in a well ventilated area following instructions on the container.

Helpful Hints

While Sunbrella fabric offers excellent protection against stains, full removal is not always guaranteed if spills are not addressed promptly.

Avoid scrubbing, hard bristle brushes or any other abrasive cleaning method.

Sunbrella should only be allowed to air dry.

Protect the area around your Sunbrella fabric when using bleach or other chemical solvents that may discolor non-Sunbrella fabrics. Always rinse Sunbrella thoroughly.

Bleach can have harmful effects on the natural environment around you. Please follow all safety and environmental precautions according to the bleach label.

If fabric has some wrinkling, use an iron on the synthetic setting. As iron temperatures may vary, first test a small inconspicuous area before ironing the entire piece.

DO NOT use a steamer or an iron set to the steam setting.

Indoor Upholstery

- Apply a light mist of mild soap and water using a spray bottle.
- Work the solution into the spill by lightly agitating the entire surface area of the fabric, moving from seam to seam, with a sponge or very soft bristle brush. Avoid scrubbing, and do not use a hard bristled brush or anything that will abrade the fabric.
- Rinse the entire fabric thoroughly to remove all soap residue.
- Blot excess moisture with a clean, soft towel or sponge.
- Blot or wet-vacuum excess water from the entire surface area of the fabric, moving from seam to seam. • Air dry. Repeat rinsing and blotting until all soap residue is removed.

Professional Cleaners

Inquire about a firm's experience working with Sunbrella fabrics and knowledge of cleaning and re-treatment requirements.

Machine Washing

Some removable casings can be washed in the washing machine, however consult the furniture manufacturer before removing the casing as cushion construction may vary. To wash, first close all zippers. Machine wash in cold water on the delicate cycle with normal amounts of mild laundry detergent. Allow fabric to air dry.

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Oil-Based Spills


Immediately apply an absorbent such as corn starch directly on the oil-based spill. Let sit for 10 minutes and remove the excess using a straight edge or ruler. This helps remove the spill and prevents it from being pressed into the fabric. Then proceed with the cleaning process.

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How to clean Revolution Performance Fabrics:

1. Remove any loose debris and blot stain.
2. Blot or spray water and bleach solution on the stain and allow the solution to soak into the fabric (if possible, place a clean towel between the fabric and foam cushion to absorb any excess moisture).
3. Thoroughly rinse fabric with water until clean.
4. Let fabric air dry
